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
A Few Words from the Author.

The story of writing this fairy tale represents a hymn to human empowerment. In 1992 my mother did a starvation strike outside the Ministry of Education, fighting for my right to study as national water polo champion. She succeeded and so I became a student. The first year of my studies, I couldn't find a job. So very often I wasn't able to pay my ticket for the bus to go to university. There was a time that I fed myself and my sister with what we found in the garbage. My only entertainment was reading, a habit that I inherited by my father. One night, I questioned myself: "I don't have money to go out. What am I going to do about it?" I read the "Little Prince" by **Antoine de Saint-Exupéry**. I thought: "I believe that I can also write a fairy tale!" From the day I wrote it until the day of its publication, 22 years went by full of mixed emotions, obstacles and challenges that led to changes in its content so it could serve a higher purpose.

The fairy tale aims at giving several messages, incarnated by human characters. Dear shows us how to search our inner selves at a deeper level reaching our destination to life by empowering ourselves and the others. Bully helps us understand that abusing one another and immorality can prevent us from creating the right team. Little Precious personifies when humans only think about themselves. Grandpapa is the figure that symbolizes the family and love. Frienda reveals that humility, modesty and trust are necessary in a friendship. In contrast, Jealous shows how damaging it can be when someone denies to recognize the values of other people and the importance of "fair play" in sport. Choosy represents the example of working together as a team. Savey saves a child from drowning revealing the value of knowing swimming and how to be safe around the water. Smiley welcomes the child offering him love and learning.

Books are dedicated to important people. The well-known Greek film director Yiannis Smaragdis has said that "in reality the creator of a film", (or in this case of the fairy tale), "is not the authentic creator but the intermediary". The supreme authority of the universe, plants ideas into his mind, and he expresses them in his own words to other people". The messages that were "embedded" in my mind, I wanted to deliver mainly to children. This is why I wanted to dedicate this fairy tale to people, who contribute to the lives of children in a meaningful way. Each time I communicate with this man, I read at the bottom of his email, the phrase: "it is easier to build strong children than to repair broken men". In the website of her organization, the woman has written: "kids go where is excitement... but they stay where there is love". I agree with both of them. I am not surprised that these extraordinary individuals are a couple. So, I dedicate this fairy tale to Greg Bonann and Tai Collins, that having established the "A Chance for Children Foundation" in the USA, they contribute in the wellbeing of at-risk children.



"Can you hit and rob somebody?"


"No, I can't!"

Dear having turned red he tried to explain:


"If you won't be my friend, I will be lonely. Let's play only for a little bit."

Her parents came out to the garden to have breakfast. She started singing to attract their attention. Dear did not say a word. He lowered his head and disappeared. It was not in his character to fight.




After a little while he reached the square. There were people walking by, who were going to work. This place reminded him his old way of life. It was so beautiful then. Everybody loved him. He had many friends.

Dear rarely got presents from his parents because they were poor. He liked the advice. He wrote it on a piece of paper so he could remember it and he made it his purpose in life.



"Look. First we will compete in swimming and then we can become friends."


"OK", he agreed and took his clothes off.

"I always win in a race. The child of the mountain beat me! I won't tolerate it!" he thought.




"Why did you swim alone? It is dangerous to swim in a sea with currents and no lifejacket", he said.

"Dear. I am a child. Give me a chance", he answered.


"My name is Smiley".

Drowning Chain of Survival

Savey taught Dear the "drowning chain of survival" (source: Szpilman et al, Resuscitation 2014) in order to prevent any aquatic accident in the future. **Tasks**: (1) Write the chain on a piece of paper. (2) Make a collage with the chain, placing inside the circles photos of people known to you (school mates, family members). (3) Explain the importance of each circle in the chain. (4) Ask a lifeguard which link is the most important.

This happens because the circumstances make us look more or less important. But only YOU must realize what your actual height is!" Dear thought that this has happened to him many times. And then try to do your best", replied Savey, who had received the same advice not so long ago from his friend Dorothy (*Dorothy, a.k.a. Dorothea in Greek, means a "gift from God"). Questions: (1) Draw an image putting yourself in the place of Dear. (2) What made an impression on you with Dear, Smiley and Savey? (3) Have you ever been told that you were something or had done something without it actually happening? If so, how did you react?



Table Game with one Dice.

Activities for the Home, Neighborhood or School

Rescue with a Human Chain

Look again at the picture that shows Dear revealing the new name of the camp, "A Chance for Children". The children are holding each other's hands. When someone is drowning, the lifesavers hold each other in a similar way to rescue the victim, by making a human chain. Discuss with a lifeguard the advantages and disadvantages of this technique.



Game with Cards.

Print the pictures on a card size. Place them between the players of the two teams. Team A pulls a card. They look at the list below and makes a question to team B, that corresponds to the card. If team B answers correctly, they win 10 points. If not, team A wins 10 points. Winning team is the one that will accumulate 100 points.

Picture 5: Tell me 2 reasons why: (a) friendship is important, (b) we accept friends as they are, (c) we wash our hands, (d) we stand by each other in difficult times, (e) we read useful books.

Picture 6: Tell me 3 applications of "fair play": (a) as a winner, (b) as a loser, (c) as a spectator, (d) as a parent of the loser, (e) as a parent of the winner. (f) Give me 5 reasons to participate in sports.

Picture 7: Tell me 3 ways: (a) to stay safe around the water, (b) for a lifeguard to save someone in the water, (c) for an amateur lifesaver to save someone in the water.

Picture 8: Tell me: (a) how would you do the "kiss of life" to someone who is not breathing, (b) how would the bystanders be able to help you, (c) the type of equipment you would need to save someone.

Picture 9: Tell me 3 ways to empower: (a) yourself, (b) the people around you. (c) How would someone need to treat you to make you feel loved and to offer knowledge?

Picture 10: Give me 2 reasons for: (a) the importance of succeeding in your goals, (b) why it is nice to participate in a good team, (c) why it is nice when you grow up to also create an opportunity for children in your own way.

The Author: Stathis Avramidis, DipEd, BEd, MSc, PhD has popularized aquatics and



water safety as athlete, instructor, academic and media professional for 30 years. He works as an Associate in the Hellenic Centre for Disease Control & Prevention and as a Director of Lifesaving Sport at the Hellenic Federation of Underwater Activity. He was a Lecturer of Aquatics / Visiting Research Fellow in Leeds Metropolitan University (UK) and Advisor of Accident Prevention - Health Education at the Secretary General of Public Health in the Ministry of

Health, the Co-Chairman of the inaugural International Aquatic History Symposium and Film Festival (IAHSFF), the creator of the Hellenic National Water Safety Program and the founder of lifesaving sport in Greece. With over 80 rescues, over 150 certifications from 10 countries, 15 books and over 300 publications/conference presentations to his credit, he is considered as one of the most dedicated water safety advocates in the world. He was also national water polo champion, award recipient in national/world beauty contests and was honored 17 times in 8 countries. This includes the Paragon Aquatic Safety and ISHOF Service awards by the International Swimming Hall of Fame, two Diplomas by the Royal Life Saving Society Commonwealth whose Patron is Queen Elizabeth II and the Best Young Film Director by the IAHSFF judging committee, whose chief film judge was Greg Bonann. In 2015, the World Open Water Swimming Association (Huntington Beach, S. California) enlisted him in the "50 Greatest Watermen in the Open Water Swimming History". He believes that when we meet, our Creator will ask what we did in our lives for love and learning.

The Illustrator: Nikos Kouremenos, B.Ed. graduated from the University of Athens with




a degree in Mathematics. In drawing and illustrations he is self-taught. He has participated in comic exhibitions and he has illustrated children's books and articles. Together with Stathis he has been working many years on lifeguard books such as The Manual of the Greek Lifeguard (1998), The Specialized Lifeguard (2001), Pool/Waterpark Lifeguarding (2003), Real Lifeguard Incidents (2006), Lifeguarding means...prevention of accidents in and around the water (2006), Aquatic Rescue and Pool/Waterpark Lifeguarding


(2007), Handbook on Safety and Lifesaving (2008), History of Aquatic Safety (2010), Baby Swimming (2012) and Mear-Death Experiences while Drowning (2015). His illustrations appeared for a decade in the popular magazines Underwater World, Greek Diver, Vythos, Fishing, Technical Rescue Magazine and Swimming Pool.

The Story of the Real ACFC Foundation.

In the early 90's Greg Bonann, the creator of the world famous TV series Baywatch,

honoree of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and the International Life Saving Federation for his outstanding work in cinematography and lifesaving, talked about the creation of a "Baywatch theme related camp." Tai Collins, a freelance writer for the show and a very decorated person, who has been honored among others with the 1999 Humanitarian Award alongside Kofi Annan and Al Gore, asked Bonann if he was serious about it. He loved the idea, but due to the heavy demands of executive producing and directing the series, he simply didn't have the time needed to bring it into fruition.







In 1992, "Camp Baywatch" came to life at Pepperdine University and quickly became more than just a summer camp. It offered a variety of programs starting in kindergarten — seeing as many youth as possible through to college. Its founders knew to make a real and significant difference; long-term relationships and programs were needed to inspire kids to believe in themselves. The greatest way to do that is through giving them something to do — to be creative, to play, to have and develop goals and dreams by positive reinforcement — using sports, role models, programs, scholarships, and life skills. The foundation continues to grow offering more programs to youth and their families.

Baywatch ended its long television run and with that ending the foundation was renamed to reflect what it does — A Chance for Children Foundation. It has grown and changed in other ways. At one time it served youth from all over the US, New Zealand and S. Africa, enabling them to have the "camp" experience. Tai and Greg have watched their own dream become real. They have now watched a generation of youth grow into adulthood seeing lives touched and changed firsthand. A Chance for Children Foundation is dedicated to children. 

A Chance for Children

Most fairy tales have a happy end too good to be true; except this one that aims to be a humn of human empowerment! It talks about an at-risk poor boy named Dear who was wandering around, saying "I am a child; give me a chance" and seeking to share with others love and learning. After he met several children that ignored and humiliated him, he was saved from drowning by a lifeguard who took him to a wonderful place so he could feel that he belongs to a group and to discover that this summer camp was called "A Chance for Children". He is the fictional protagonist of the fairytale. His story represents the obstacles and challenges which millions of children experience in their everyday lives globally.

The most fundamental needs in all cultures are love and learning. When someone is dreaming of them, this dream may become true, like what happened with Dear.

The "A Chance for Children" Foundation does exist for real from the inspirational work of its creators. It was founded in 1992 as Camp Baywatch from Greg Bonann (honoree of the International Swimming Hall of Fame and creator of the TV series Baywatch) and his partner at work and in life, Tai Collins (Miss Virginia-USA 1983, screenwriter of Baywatch). When the well-known worldwide series came to an end, the foundation was renamed (achanceforchildren.org) and it continues today to offer assistance and opportunities to homeless and at-risk children.
